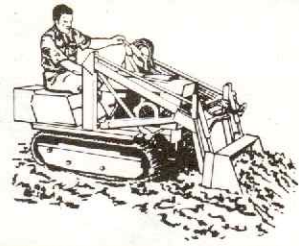




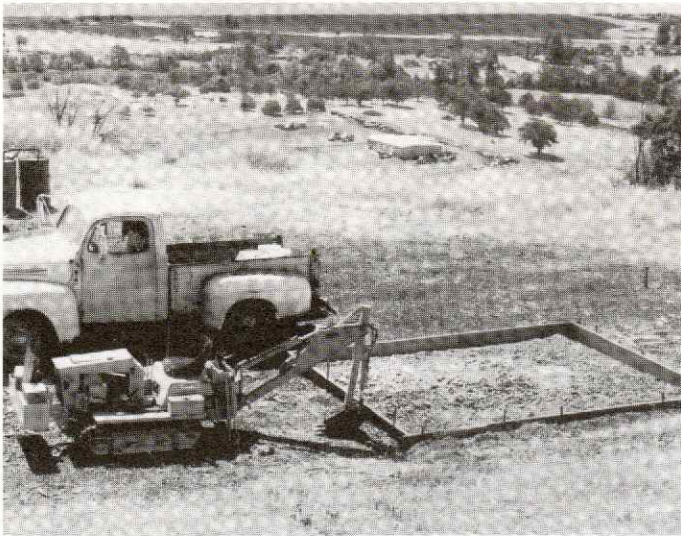

## A MAN AND HIS MACHINE!

Donald J. Parsio of Roseburg, Oregon wanted to share his experiences with us. He writes, "In the 2 years I have owned the Magnatrac, I estimate that I have done over \$5,000 worth of work with it. These pictures are only a sample of what I have done. I have made many demonstrations with the unit, and in 1979, sold 3 tractors, for which I received commissions from you."



The above photo shows an area of Mr. Parsio's 42 acre ranch. He continues, "We used the backhoe to do the foundation excavation for the first building slab on my ranch. The whole site is solid shale, which was quite a challenge for the machine. It performed admirably." Below photo shows the result. The slab is completed and its time for a break.



Installation of 18" x 25 feet long metal culvert was readily handled by the Struck Magnatrac with Blade. "Magnatrac was used to tow pipe to project (about 1/4 mile) and to backfill and compact material over pipe. Estimated backfill - 6 yards." Below photo shows completed project.



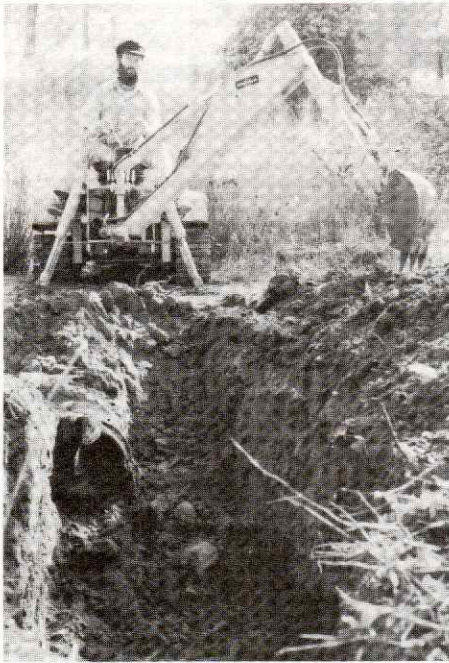
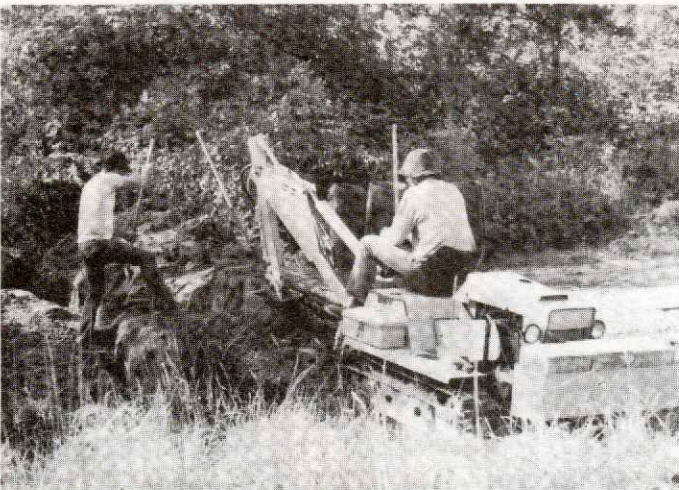


Photo at left shows excavation for and installation of 24" x 20' metal culvert. Note the old 12" concrete pipe shown is to be removed. The backhoe excavation alongside is for the new 24" diameter metal culvert.

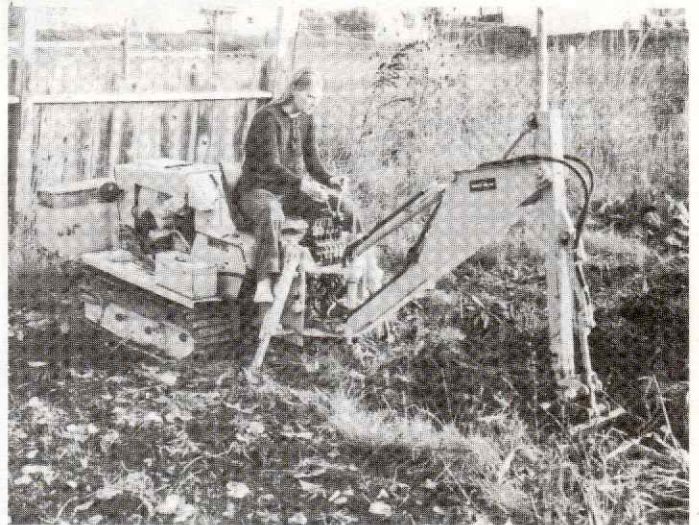
Below photo shows backfilling over the new pipe. "Total job excavation = 12 yards."



The MAG II Magnatractor has tremendous pulling capacity as proven by Mr. Parsio's logging project. Photo shows unit pulling "a 16" diameter, 35 feet long" log for the building of a log house.



Other jobs around the ranch include road grading. The MAG II with blade handles this with ease.



Mrs. (Laurie) Parsio also uses the Magnatractor. Here Mrs. Parsio is digging a trench for a water line to the garden.

Mr. Parsio adds, "I look forward to doing much more work with the unit. Future jobs for it include - Foundation excavations for 2 more large buildings; installation of a septic system; about 1/2 mile of trenching for water and electrical lines; building a road around my 42 acre ranch; plus many small jobs."
